For English, please have a go at the following activities:

- Write an imaginary story based on a castle.
- Do some research about kings and queens.
- Y1 practise spellings from your book that you've found difficult throughout the year.
- Reception and Y1 keep practising your phonics and tricky words from your keyrings. A little every day is best.
- Try the 'Teach your monster to read' app.
- Make up a play about castles and act it out with your family.
- Get reading and share your favourite books as much as possible!

Our History topic is all about Kings and Queens. These are some activities you could try:

- Research a monarch of England and create a fact file about them.
- Draw/label a castle for your monarch to live in-or build one out of Lego/junk modelling!
- Become a monarch! Make yourself a crown and list the different rules you would have if you were a monarch for the day.
- Create your own family tree! Templates for this will be available on the Twinkl website.

Whilst this time of school closure means us asking you to work from home, please also take time to do the things you enjoy—these activities aren't an exhaustive list so if you have other ideas we would love to hear about them when we return to school.

For maths, please have a go at the following activities:

- Look for 2D and 3D shapes around your home.
- Draw sets of 3D shapes you find with square faces, circular faces or triangular faces.
- Count forwards and back in many different ways e.g. up and down stairs, sharing out sweets etc (Y1 to 100).
- Follow a recipe. Measure ingredients carefully using scales and measuring jugs.
- Y1 times tables (2s, 5s and 10s) - chant them, write them, make them from objects
- Y1s number bonds to 10 and 20 (e.g. 6+4, 7+3, 16+4, 17+3)

Our Science topic is Plants:

- Look at the different plants in your garden/surrounding area. Can you identify them?
- Draw/paint/collage pictures of different plants and trees that you can see.
